


The Rotary Club of Space Center's International Youth Exchange program was established in 1986 to foster world peace through understanding. The program has had 37 outbound and 38 inbound students since its establishment. The club also founded the Rotary World Health Foundation which has helped to treat 15 children with severe disfigurations, with corrective surgery from a local doctor, hospital and with the help of host families who provided care during the children's recovery.

In addition, the Rotary Club of Space Center has provided over 450 bicycles and scooters to needy children in the greater Houston area and has spread awareness about the children in Chinandega, Nicaragua, who lived off a dumpsite. Since 2005, the Rotary Club of Space Center's financial efforts have provided many natives of Mexico with restored eyesight at the Guerrero Eye Clinic, in Mexico, allowing them to lead productive lives. The club has spearheaded various water projects, and honored several teachers in the Clear Creek Independent School district for their great dedication to student success and involvement with parents and the community. The Rotary Club of Space Center has also assisted in water treatment, sanitation and a hygiene project in Trojes, Honduras, raising \$130,000 in district and club donations across the U.S., Honduras and Brazil. The project deployed biosand filters and latrines to 1,700 people in 10 communities.
