### WORLD UNDERSTANDING WEEK

This month we join Rotary clubs around the world in observing World Understanding Week (20-26 February). This important week includes Rotary's 78th Anniversary (23 February), which for the first time is being observed in the Rotary world as World Understanding and Peace Day. As part of their observance of this day, clubs have been asked by the Board of R.I. to consider a one dollar (US\$1.00) per capita contribution to: (1) a World Community Service project, or (2) The Rotary Foundation.

## BOARD SUGGESTS 60 PERCENT RULE

The R. I. Board of Directors has amended Article IV of the Recommended Rotary Club By-laws by adding a new paragraph to Section 2 as follows:

"All members excepting an honorary member (or a past service or senior active member excused by the Board of Directors of this club, pursuant to sub-sections (c) and (d) of Section 5 of Article VIII of the Standard Club Consitution) in good standing in this club, on the day of the regular meeting, must be counted as present or absent, and attendance must be evidenced by the member's being present for at least sixty(60) percent of the time devoted to the regular meeting, either at this club or at any other Rotary club."

USE ROTARY'S 78TH ANNIVERSARY TO INSPIRE CLUB GROWTH....Seventy-eight years ago in Chicago, Illinois, U.S.A., Rotary was born. Since that wintry night on 23 February, Rotary, beginning with only four men, has grown to an organization of more than 912,000 service-minded men. This remarkable growth in members (net average: about 11,700 a year) has been the life blood of the organization.

But sustained growth is not easy. To off-set the normal ten percent annual attrition in clubs and to meet President Hiroji Mukasa's request for a minimum net increase of three members per club in 1982-83, a club of 50 will have to admit at least eight new members by 30 June, 1983, the end of this Rotary year.

The theme of a concerted effort to increase membership during this Anniversary month could be "Share the benefits of Rotary with other men." No club can really say it has reached optimum size. It must gain new ideas, new leadership, fresh enthusiasm.
