

ROTARY MEMBERSHIP RULE UPHELD BY CALIFORNIA COURT....On February 8, 1983, a California court confirmed that Rotary's male only membership rule conforms to California law. The rule was challenged by the former Rotary Club of Duarte, whose charter was withdrawn by Rotary International in 1978 after it admitted three women as members. Subsequently, the club brought suit in the Superior Court of the State of California for the County of Los Angeles. It contended, essentially, that women, through being denied Rotary club membership, were impeded in entering or pursuing their businesses or professions. A key finding of the court: Rotary is not a "business establishment"....and that women "merely were denied the privilege of joining with individuals from other vocations, professions and businesses in a community service organization." Rotary's policy with regard to business and professional relations is that a Rotarian should not expect - and far less should he ask for - more consideration or advantage from a fellow Rotarian than the latter would give to any other business or professional associate.

WHAT ARE THE TOP 4 TIMEWASTERS.....

1. DOING WORK BENEATH YOUR CAPABILITIES. A recent survey showed that executives spend only 47% of their time on executive tasks. If a task can be done by someone else, it should be.
