Is a Paul Harris Fellow to be purchased or is it an honor to be awarded? Each year thousands of Rotarians face this question as they evaluate their commitment to support the programs of The Rotary Foundation. "To give a Paul Harris Fellow as an award is only one of many ways to contribute to the Foundation," said William Robbins, "it is not the sole intention behind the program." "The Rotarian who becomes a Fellow by contributing to the Foundation himself," continued Chairman Bill, "is making a personal expression of support to the Foundation in memory and honor of Rotary's founder, Paul P. Harris...he is not purchasing an award for himself. The individual who contributes to The Rotary Foundation or who gives of his time and talents is the one responsible for today's unprecedented accomplishments of the Foundation in promoting international understanding." Dr. Mohamed Fateen, a member of the Rotary Club of Cairo, Arab Republic of Egypt, captured the essence of the program by contributing US\$1,000 in honor of his wife. Twenty-year-old John J. Zaleski, the son of a Rotarian from Seminole, Florida, U.S.A., gave US\$1,000 to the Foundation, becoming the youngest person to contribute for his own Paul Harris Fellow. Using wages earned from a part-time job, John was convinced that supporting this proven and effective force for international understanding was the right thing to do. Contributions from Paul Harris Fellows represent a glorious past as well as the key to a future of expansion, improvement and continued effectiveness in fostering better understanding among all people. When you are ready, ask yourself, "Will I take advantage of the opportunity to support. The Rotary Foundation through my contribution to become a Paul Harris Fellow?" Or, "Will the Foundation continue without my support?" Harry Lackey, a member of the Rotary Club of Montgomery, Alabama, U.S.A., asked himself these questions. His reply was, "I look at what I want to leave behind and one thing is to repay Rotary for the inspiration it gave me and, in a small way, to try and do some good for others less fortunate. To Be a Paul Harris Fellow is my "selection!"



He credited the test...a simple 24 word statement of principles governing the things we think, say and do....with helping the business become profitable again.
