

### Recent Board Actions

1984-85 BOARD

**RESIGNATION:** Herb McElveen submitted a letter of resignation, citing business reasons. The Board approved his request with regrets. Herb has been a longtime member of the club, active in his service.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS:** Some, not all, committee reports were submitted, using the format approved.

FREE ENTERPRISE SEMINAR: The Board approved \$500.00 for the expense of sending a teacher to the District Free Enterprise Seminar to be held at Columbia Lakes this summer.

**DISTRICT CONFERENCE**: There are 24 Space Center Rotarians registered to attend the District Conference in Galveston.

ATTENDANCE: There are several club members on the verge of being dropped for lack of attendance. They are to be informed of their situation.————Our Club attendance is averaging 2 percent below the District average. The Attendance Committee will be asked to address this problem.

#### 1985-86 BOARD

Directors are to select and confirm committee chairmen, and start them working on the committee plans and goals for the coming Rotary year. Three committee members will conduct interviews with the eight CLHS applicants and report findings to the full committee for final selection.

PUBLIC RELATIONS, under John Francis, continued work on update of club display for the District Conference.


