MEETING OF AUGUST 4: The Director of NASA's Johnson Space Center, Jesse Moore, discussed the challenges that face the space agency. He noted that while the US space program is temporarily grounded, our foreign competitors are moving forward at a rapid pace. He was recently in the Soviet Union, where he observed research taking place that he believes to be aimed at new long duration manned missions. He highlighted the French committment as a strong one and mentioned the growing Chinese capability for launching satellites. As his main topic, (Continued on page 2)



Mr. Moore presented his five priorities for JSC:

- -Get the Space Shuttle back to flight status.
- -Oet the Space Station formally approved, moving from preliminary design to hardware stage.
- -Strengthening the institution of JSC by acquiring and developing the best talent available as well as the facility and equipment for the talent to use.
- -Strengthening the NASA family to bring all its assets to bear
- -Focus on areas of high technology that JSC is particularly well equipped to provide: artificial intelligence, robotics, and bio-technology.

Mr. Moore concluded with a status report on the Space Station. (Continued on page 5) $\,$







MEETINO OF AUGUST 11: Ray Cullen, NBC News Bureau Chief for the Southwest vas introduced by Al Jowid. Mr. Cullen has an extensive background in network news on the national scene. He provided some very interesting insight on the responsibilities of the TV news industry and discussed several of the criticisms that are frequently aimed at the news media. He talked about how it is determined what is newsworthy. He also discussed the perception that so much of the news is negative. Mr. Cullen also pointed out how our own bias can lead us to believe that the news is bias if it doesn't agree with us. He described circumstances under which the news is sometimes withheld, such as danger to an individual or national security. He emphasized the need to be "obviously fair" in dealing with politics and catestrophic accidents in which controversial decisions were involved. In summary, it was an excellent program presented by someone who obviously was extremely familiar with his subject.

PERSPECTIVE






