OCTOBER 6, 1986 OH, THAT '86 SHRIMPOREE



Bill Moyers Talks on Rotary

(Ed. Note: The Rotarian for Sept. carried a moving and thoughtful interview with Bill Moyers. Here is a special part of it that I think tells us a lot of what we are and what we can do as Space Center Rotary.)

Question to Moyers: Do you think volunteer organizations like Rotary can effect change or solve some of the problems of the world?

Moyers: I think that service organizations like Rotary can make the biggest difference. Government's gotten so huge and complex, with so many rules and so many regulations, that it takes a long time for a good impulse to become an effective program. It's as de Tocqueville noted many years ago when he came here in the 1830's: America is a society of volunteer associations. Volunteer associations have the motive: thev the have flexibility: they have the commitment to truly act more rapidly and do more effectively what other huge. complex institutions cannot do.

Rotary can't do what government has to do. It can't put a floor under the poor; it can't build an army and a navy and an air force; it can't do all of those things that only government can do. It can't make a profit the way corporations do. But what service organizations like Rotary can do is identify local causes, local needs, and local individuals — and say, "We will (Continued on next page)


