PROGRAM NOTES

MEETING OF OCTOBER 20: The program was delivered by John B. Holmes, the Harris County District Attorney. He spoke on the criminal justice system in Texas. Holmes departed from the usual format when he invited questions from the floor at the beginning of his presentation. After fielding a few questions, he launched into what he called his commercial message. What he presented was an astounding series of facts and figures on the short duration of sentences served by criminals in this state and the committing of criminal acts by criminals that have been paroled early by the state. According to Holmes, this is all caused by overcrowding in the state prison system and the legislature's /courts' decisions to release criminals early if we do not have adequate facilities to house them for the full service of their sentence. He reminded us that we need to notify our legislature of our desires in this area or quit complaining about

"Due to excessive absences, the following Rotary attendance enforced rules will immediately!



MEETING OF OCTOBER 27: Marta Greytok, above, the chairperson of our Harris County Appraisal District, spoke to us about her administration of the district. She gave some history of the decision to adopt a central appraisal district system in Texas and the problems that it caused for large metropolitan areas such as Harris County, with its million-plus pieces of property and 400 taxing entities. She also spoke of some of the accomplishments of her administration, in particular the privatization of a number of the specialized functions of the district. Greytok is a strong believer in the privatization process and its ability to place control of government service functions in the hands of the taxpayer, who is the consumer for most of government's services. ---She also reminded us that tomorrow, November 4, is an election day. 
Golf ...






