MEETING OF NOVEMBER 24: Rotarian Al Ligrani introduced the club to Dr. Paulo Ferreira, a radiotherapy specialist from Brazil. Dr. Ferreira's program to us was a review of his activities and observations as a Rotary Foundation scholar. He is studying at M. D. Anderson Hospital in his specialty so that he may carry the latest methods of cancer treatment back to his native country. The character and quality of young people that are aided by the Rotary Foundation continues to be more impressive with each participant that we meet.

MEETING OF DECEMBER 1: Past District Governor Paul Jury and Past President Bill Webb were a dynamic duo on this Monday's program. They were discussing the merits and activities of the Rotary Foundation. The program was introduced by Past District Governor Floyd Boze. With this much brass at the head table, you can be sure that the allotted time was used in full. Governor Paul gave us a very inspiring preview of Rotary on the international scene for the next twenty years. He discussed the Polio Plus program in some depth and explained how we are going to work to eradicate polic and five other childhood diseases from the earth by the year 2005. That means providing vaccines for diseases that are killing 4 million children a year around the globe. Bill Webb provided some facts and figures from Rotary International's annual report to support Paul's feeling that we are entering into a new cycle of service in Rotary. He pointed out that programs like the Rotary Foundation are now supported by 1,000,000 men around the globe. That potential for service is almost overwhelming. (More on this later. #### LOOK AT IT THIS WAY

"A Paul Harris Fellow Award is one of the highest honors that can come to a Rotarian, but we must recognize wherein the honor truly lies. It does not come to the recipient because someone pinned a blue ribbon on his cost, but because someone cared enough about the work the Foundation is doing to give \$1000 so the work might be continued.

"If someone pays for his own Paul Harris Award he has not bought a medal to pin on himself; he is receiving recognition for a gift sufficient to inoculate 10,000 children in India against Red Measles--- a gift which might save 100 lives.--- Have you given lately?"
