PROGRAM NOTES

MEETING OF OCTOBER 19: Congratulations to our newest Paul Harris Fellow, Jack Denike. Good work, Jack. (Photo page 4)

District Governor Al Busse keynoted our program on Polio-Plus, a worldwide program of Rotary International to eradicate Polio and 5 other dread but immunizable diseases by the year 2005 through mass innoculation of children, primarily in the third world. It is the goal of our district to raise \$1 million of the \$120 million needed to purchase the vaccine. That's right, when we give, we are just paying for vaccine, no overhead, no doctors' salaries, etc. UNICEF and the World Health Organization are our partners in this as are Rotary Clubs around the world. Between them they provide the volunteers and trained people needed to assure that every child in the world has been vaccinated.

Gov. Al's guest, Rhonda Breedlove, was a victim of the last polio epidemic in the US which occurred in 1954. While she has successfully overcome the difficulties caused by polio, she does have to live with the muscle destruction and post-polio syndrome which eventually attacks the muscles that compensate for the destroyed muscles. In some victims, polio destroys the muscles related to breathing and causes death. At a cost of just \$0.12 per shot, this has got to be the most cost effective investment you could make--- and if you give by December 31, your gift will be doubled by a matching donation.

MEETING OF OCTOBER 26: Al Jowid introduced Gerry Griffin, President and CEO of the Greater Houston Chamber of Commerce, formerly a 25-year NASA employee whose last assignment was as head of the Johnson Space Center. Accompanying Gerry was Ellie Aldridge, Marketing Executive of the Houston Economic Development Commission. Key points of Gerry's address:

Skyboxes needed to help keep the Oilers in Houston.

The banking/financial community was the last to recognize the downturn and will be the last to come out of it.

The Houston workforce doubled between 1973 and 1984. We are now back to the 1982 level of jobs.

The winner of the Space Station contract gets to buy one of the Stadium

- ☐ The Clear Lake and Texas Medical Center areas are top bright spots in Houston's economy. Space and medicine are increasingly recognized as Houston's strengths.
- The Houston Chamber serves as an umbrella for local chambers such as ours.
- The want ad index, a tried and true economic indicator, has been up for the past 4 months, indicating that the Houston economy has bottomed out and the "entrepreneurial juices" are again flowing. Unemployment is down from 12% to under 9%.
- \square We must use our political clout (while we have it)- look what the "Tip O'Neal" years did for Massachusetts.
- ☐ We must think internationally, not just in terms of Clear Lake, Houston, Texas or even national markets.
- \square Despite dramatic gains, Atlanta has kept a "crisis mentality" about competing for new business opportunities. Houston must do the same.

An unusual "second wind" session then involved a thorough presentation by officials of the Italian Space Agency. Charlie Whynot read a proclamation from Judge John Lindsay recognizing the importance of the Houston-Italy Week" and the visit of our speakers and special guests: Carlo Bongiorno, Director of the Italian (Continued on page 4)




MEMBER PROFILES
