



She spent 6 weeks traveling around India by car, train, and jeep and visiting dozens of Rotary clubs and dental facilities (since she is a dentist). Her group was hosted in great style and with extremely warm friendliness--they were often welcomed ceremoniously with flowers and leis.

- Many Indian Rotary Clubs sponsor schools for the handicapped.
- Having many children is still the most common means of providing for one's security in later years.
- India is positive about the US but must keep on the good side of Russia.
- We are considered economic "spoiled brats" in the eyes of many Indians.
- One factory converts cow manure into methane gas for fuel.
- In the spirit of Rotary's OSE, Myra's group "went with good will, spread it abroad, and returned with understanding".


Charles Hartman told us about plans for the 2nd Annual Rotary National Award for Space Achievement (RNASA) to be held Feb. 19th at the Hyatt Regency. Tickets are \$200 each. This event raises funds for space-related education and draws positive public attention to the importance of continuing achievements in space. Dr. Abdel Fustok reported on our "Plastic Surgery" program in co-sponsorship with St. John Hospital. Beneficiaries are 3rd world youth without financial means to correct deformities caused by birth defects or accidents, often burns, and whose country has no provision to perform the needed operation. We presently are helping with an 11-year old boy from Mexico who has been here for over 2 months.

After 2 new members were inducted (see page 2), Jay Welch introduced Floyd Boze, who substituted for Education Commissioner Kirby, who was fogged in at Austin. Floyd proceeded to cleverly re-introduce himself (at some length, of course, but in a spirit of humor--as this is, Floyd). Out of the "vapor" emerged these messages:
