MEETING NOTES


MEETING OF DEC 7: Speaker for the day was Dr. Robert F. Hodgin, Associate Professor of Economics, School of Business and Public Administration, UHCL. He provided figures to support his belief that the ecomomic impact on Clear Lake and Houston from the Space Station Work Package II and the new JSC Visitor Center will make our area "take off like a rocket". He foresaw all the usable first class office space now on hand will be occupied and more built. The major impact from Work Package II is considered to be in the 1990-1991 time frame. Adding in the Visitor Center considerably increases the business effect and shifts the maximum from these two factors alone to the 1991-1992 period. He thought buying existing office buildings would be a good investment. But both the prospect and the timing have to be hedged a bit because of the federal budget backing process that is going on.

MEETING OF DEC 14: Terry Hesson presented checks (opposite page) to our number 1 and number 2 Shrimporee beneficiaries. A \$5000 Check was presented to Judy Monahans, Board Chairman of Interfaith Caring Ministries, a joint effort between 15 Bay Area Churches that distributes food, Christmas gifts and even money (for rent, utilities or gasoline) to families with no other financial resources.

A \$2500 check was presented to Mary White, Vice President of the Family Outreach Center, an organization that promotes happy family life through parenting and child care classes, help to families experiencing undue stress, and training to help children to protect themselves against sexual abuse.

Our speaker was State Senator Buster Brown, one of only 6 Republicans in the Texas State Senate. He enlightened us on several issues including:

- □ Tax increases: Until the dedicated funding formulas are modified, only 20% of the budget can be influenced by the legislature-- a factor that makes future tax increases inevitable.
- ☐ The Space Science Industry Commission is part of the new Texas Department of Commerce and will advocate for the growth of space related industries.
- U Workfare has been passed by the legislature but shelved by the Dept. of Health and Human Services.
- Equalization of education if taken to its logical limits would require an additional \$50 billion a year to give equal resources to all school children.




