
☐ M. D. Anderson networks with Oncologists in Community Hospitals like Humana Clear Lake and St. John.

 \square M. D. Anderson hospital started 35 years ago in a house; now its anual budget is \$320 million and it employs 6000 and cares for 1500-1800 patients per day. \square New "Biologic Manipulators" can help the body's natural defense system kill cancer cells.

 \square Cancer risks can be controlled: 30-35% by diet, 30-32% by not using tobacco, 33-40% by other factors, such as additives, industrial hazards, pollution, and heredity.

MEETING OF FEB 29: George Fleming introduced Larry Mathis, President and CEO of the Methodist Hospital System, which includes 31 hospitals. Larry showed us how the "experts" have not accurately predicted health care trends and offered some "non-expert" (tounge-in-cheek) prognostications:

☐ The emergence of networks of "sattelite" hospitals serviced by "Sophisticated Centers of Excellence" with the former providing primary, emergency, outpatient and long term care, while the latter provide specialized, high-tech, ambulatory and trauma care.

 \square By 1991, AIDS care will cost \$16 billion- over 5 times the cost of all cardiovascular surgery.

☐ Health care consumes 11% of our GNP and is going to increase that share.

 \square For-profit and HMO-type organizations are about 20% of the health care industry and on the decrease.

☐ As baby boomers approach and pass 40, they will join the elderly generation (their parents) in voting for better health care services.

District Governor Al Busse recently received the Outstanding Citizens Award from the Houston Chapter of the Public Relations Society of America for taking a leading role in community, charity and civic events outside of duties required for employment or direct client work.




