

MEETING OF MAR 7: Pat Hallisey, Director of Galveston Coumty's Parks and Recreation, described the myriad of facilities operated by his department that are so close at hand to us and free or available for a modest fee. Among the 51 recreation facilities there are new "pocket parks" behind the beach, RV parks, a water reservoir park with big catfish, the Texas City dike, a new boat ramp to be built under the 146 bridge at Kemah, Bayshore Park, Walter Hall Park, and the seawall (the longest continuous sidewalk in the world).

MEETING OF MAR. 14: Speaker for the day was Kevin Edwards, Director at the Transitional Learning Community in League City. Jack Catron did the introduction. For brain damaged adults, the group provides help to retrain them to become mostly self-supporting, independently functioning again. As technology helps more people survive accidents, there are more people to rehabilitate-after they have completed their hospital stay. Jobs are found for these people after an evaluation of their potential. The goal is to help them achieve their maximum level of functioning and stay up there.




