Mr. Yasuo Hori, Consul-General of Japan at Houston, spoke to our club on November 21, about bilateral relations and the trade imbalance. Mr. Hori stated that we need to emphasize increasing exports, not decreasing imports. He opposes the Omnibus Trade Act as proctectionist. He favors a Japan-U.S. Special Trade Agreement, such as we have with Canada, and quoted U.S. Ambassador to Japan Mike Mansfield, who said "Japan's markets are more open than Americans realize, although less open than the Japanese contend."

Earlier in the year Scott was with Don and Beverly Kyle and Bruce and Karen McCorkle, with some time also being spent with Alan and Mary Allen Wylie. He has participated in school activities and enjoyed the company of many of the young ladies (perhaps his favorite activity). He served as one of the managers of the Clear Lake High School football team. During the summer he worked at several businesses, including the JSC Credit Union (compliments of Mike Brown) and the office of Dr. Val Guzman, a local chiropractor (compliments of Karen Birchenough). Scott enjoyed both of the firms very much. He learned to "talk Texan", meaning to slow down so that he could be understood. He acquired a cowboy hat from the Credit Union and acquired enough pins for his jacket to sink a battleship. Scott exhibited talents as a house painter (2 house interiors) and a cook. She will be making a visit with the Cordells to Galveston for "Dickens on the Strand" soon. She is also planning a sailing trip with Scott and host Kyle Sprecher. 

Members are invited to attend the Board of Directors meetings that are held on the first and third Tuesdays at 7:00 a.m. at the Hilton.




