
Space Center Rotary has enjoyed the experience of having two excellent exchange students participate in the International Youth exchange program in the past two years, Scott Salmond from Australia and Wiebke Ernst from West Germany. Scott is now back in Australia and Wiebke will be leaving this August. They have added much joy and enthusiasm to Space Center Rotary and we will all miss their presence.

The International Youth Exchange is now accepting new applications to the long term program which will begin in the middle of August and carry through for one calendar year. If you know of a student who would be interested in expanding his/her awareness of other cultures in another country please take the action of informing a member of the International Youth Exchange Committee. It will enable this opportunity to become a reality for the student. The objective is for the family of each exchange student to host the foreign student. Hosting means that you house the foreign student in your home, offer some planned activities, provide some transportation, and help the student participate in the Rotary Exchange Student group activities. Currently, we have students from fifteen countries who desire to come to the United States and exchange with students from our community. Do a student a favor and encourage him/her to become a Rotary exchange student this year.

The International Youth Exchange awarded a \$1000 scholarship for the short term summer program to Maria Parra of Clear Creek High School. Maria was one of four applicants for the short term program. Gretchen Helling, Sheila Appan, and Lisa Singhania were the other applicants. They were all very qualified students, and we hope they will follow through with their interest in visiting another country through our exchange program. Congratulations to Maria and best wishes on her trip to France, an experience to remember forever!

This will be the third or fourth year we've enjoyed a visit from the East Texas exchange students. This is the highlight of our year as 10-12 students will be coming to visit. It is most enjoyable to see the many exchange students make new friends. The date for the trip has been confirmed for April 6-9. The activities will be a guided tour of NASA and the Texas Medical Center, a visit to see the Houston Astros play at the Astrodome, a beach party in Galveston hosted by Mark and Fran Holcomb, and the Texas Tumbleweed for dining and dancing. Our Rotarians will again have the opportunity to host a student or an East Texas Rotary family for the three days during their visit. It will be necessary for them to have sleeping arrangements and breakfast with you and your family during their stay. Please step out in fellowship and be a host during this special exchange of family and friends.

Space Center Rotary Club Proposal and Induction of New Members


Important Notes

- 1. Membership is by invitation, not application.
- 2. Membership Proposal forms are available from the Club Secretary.
- 3. QUALIFICATIONS: The prospective member must be personally and actively engaged in a business or profession and must have his or her place of business or residence within the club's territory or within the territorial limits of an immediately adjoining club.
- 4. UNFILLED CLASSIFICATIONS: Every Rotarian shares the responsibility of seeking qualified prospects for new or unfilled classifications. In this way every member can help our Club achieve a full representation of the business and professional life of the community.

5. ADDITIONAL ACTIVES: Any active member may propose to active membership one additional person who is actively engaged in the same classification of business or profession as that of the proposer. Qualifications are the same as

those required for active membership.

6. Prospects should not be informed of being proposed until clearing the Board. This helps save possible embarrassment for the prospect, the proposer, and the Club. To maintain confidentiality, it is helpful to list Rotarians as references when possible. Do not ask the prospect if he/she is interested in becoming a member. Insteadtry to "read between the lines" to determine if the otherwise qualified prospect has the time and interest. After Board approval and an orientation meeting with a Rotary Information Committee member, the prospect will be able to make an informed decision.

The Reverse Draw Fun-D-Fest Dinner will be held at South Shore Harbour Hotel on June 1. The Buddy Kirk Band will play.




