

International Youth Visit From East Texas

Members of the Space Center Rotary Club entertained 15 international youth exchange students over the past weekend (April 6-9). Four of the exchange students were year-long students hosted within the Houston District 589 Rotary Clubs. Nine of the students were Rotary exchange students who were brought down by an East Texas Rotary district for the weekend. The remainder of the students were ones in the Clear Lake area who joined in the festivities.


The spring weekend has become a tradition between the two Rotary districts. This was the third year that the East Texans have visited the Houston/Clear Lake area. The weekend included a visit to Astroworld, tours of NASA and the Galleria area, an afternoon at a beach house in Galveston (courtesy of Mark and Fran Holcombe), and a night at the Texas Tumbleweed. Rotarians and teenagers alike were somewhat tired at the end, but many lasting friendships were made. Everyone had one great time.

The home countries of the teenagers included Brazil (3), South Afrida (2), West Germany (3), Australia, New Zealand, Denmark, the Netherlands, Sweden, and Japan (2). Maria Parra, Michelle Watts, and Christine Warren were Clear Lake area high school students who hosted some of the students and participated in all of the activities.

Local Rotarians who coordinated many of the activities were Sandy Griffin, Karen Birchenough, and Alan Wylie. Other Rotarians hosting students were Ray and Myra Hooker, Al and Adele Jowid, Al Jowid (the newer generation), and Bill and Joan Geissler. Friends and neighbors of Rotarians joined in by hosting students and participating in the activities.

Plans are now in the works for the Space Center Rotary Club to take the District 589 students to East Texas. The students will also be able to get together in a Rotary tour scheduled in mid-June which will originate in Albuquerque and cover some of the western states.

Changing subjects: After hosting two international exchange students over the past two years, the Space Center Rotary Club will have to forego hosting a student in 1989-90 unless four families express an interest in this activity. A videotape is available which provides an excellent summary of the program. The Unlimited Hydro Plant Boat Race on Clear Lake will be held May 19-21. It is sponsored by Friendswood Development and Exxon. The Rotary emblem will appear on the publicity materials, so Rotary should receive a good deal of favorable publicity from this event. This event is expected to attract at least 100,000 people to the Clear Lake area. The Houston Rotary has agreed to man this project. The Downtown Rotary Club is requesting that our club, as well as other Rotary clubs, the Jaycees, and the Boy Scouts provide some of the 300 to 500 volunteers needed. All profits will be divided among the clubs and groups participating. (This project is expected to produce between \$30,000 and \$60,000 in profits for Rotary International projects and for the other groups participating.) Lonnie Clement has agreed to chair our club's efforts and will follow up with additional information.

The Reverse Draw Fun-D-Fest Dinner will be held at South Shore Harbour Hotel on June 1. The Buddy Kirk Band will play.


