#### AFRICAN JOURNAL

(The following is the second in a series of excerpts of a letter from Warner Marsh, our exchange student to Nairobi, Kenya. Warner visited our club a few months ago before he left for Kenya. He has expressed a desire to hear from anyone who can find the time to write. His address is: Warner Marsh, Nairobi Central YMCA, P. O. Box 63063, Nairobi, Kenya.)

October 22, 1990

I have had enough outside confirmation to convince me of the veracity of Gordon's wonderful stories. But even if some of you don't believe this could all be true, it doesn't really matter. As my grandmother Annchen used to say, "Never let the truth get in the way of a good story."

So on to now. When I went to register for classes at the University bright and early Monday morning, October 1, the department chair said that they were not yet sure if they would be offering the program I had been accepted for! But in any case, they wouldn't be able to tell me anything for a week. Well, Gordon was leaving that very afternoon to push on northward on the next leg of his grand "safari". He was looking for a traveling partner so I

said, "What the hell!" I would drive as far as Assis Abbaba with him, then fly or hitch back on a Red Cross food aid truck.

Off we went. As we drove north that afternoon, we paid a visit to Muranga, where we were received graciously by Gordon's modern-day counterpart, the district officer for Kangema, and his boss, the district commissioner. Kikuyuland, to the immediate north of metropolitan Nairobi, is a verdant, green area of steep hills covered with coffee trees. tobacco, and other crops. We continued to climb the winding road leading to Mt. Kenya and the Aberdares. We has planned to stay with a friend of Gordon's whom he had not seen for some 20 years, but when we stopped to ask around in Nyeri, we heard that she had been killed years ago. So we pushed on. As the hills around Mt. Kenya leveled out into high plains, we "quibbled" (camped) off to the side of the road. I awoke the next morning jsut in time to witness my first sunrise over Africa.




