

CLEARLY A WORTHWHILE DRUG PREVENTION PROGRAM

Don Shiqekawa, CCISD Drug Education Counselor, and students from Clear Lake, Clear Brook, and Clear Lake High Schools informed our club of the C.L.E.A.R. (Clean Living Encouragement and Responsibility) Program they are trying to institute in their respective schools. Brad Bailey, Ryan Mossman, and Sean Granere are very excited about this program which rewards students who are drug free. Drugs are a major problem in our schools (and our society) today. All students who enroll in this program will be given a C.L.E.A.R. identification card. They will be subject to random drug testing. As long as they test negative, they will be able to retain their identification card which entitles them to special discounts and services at local businesses. Brad Bailey advised that the program initially needs \$50,000 to get it started. So far, they have been able to raise \$10,000. Carlos Villagomez, and other members of our Club, were so impressed by the purpose and enthusiasm of this group that they agreed to sponsor 10 students each. St. John Hospital has also elected to make CCISD's C.L.E.A.R. Program the benefactor of the proceeds from their Second Annual Celebrity Golf Classic to be held March 18 at the Bay Oaks Country Club.

Commitee Report

Robin Riley has asked me to give you some of the facts regarding the proposed Community Center to be built in Clear Lake Park.

After several years of looking for a long-term project to support, the Board of Directors upon recommendation of the Long-Range Planning Committee voted to underwrite up to \$100,000 over a term not to exceed 5 years. Local groups headed by the areas' senior citizens have already raised \$100,000 of the needed \$200,000 to begin developing and building the Center.

The building will be approximately 14,000 square feet; seat up to 600 people; have a full commercial kitchen, meeting room to hold up to 40 or 50 people; and house permanent records of our club. The total cost of the (public/private) building will be over \$800,000.

Our portion of the money will be raised through fund-raising projects. Nothing out of the rotarians' pockets.




