

PROJECT GRADUATION

At the May 6th meeting, fellow Rotarian (Galveston) and Chairman of CLEAR LAKE HIGH SCHOOL'S Project Graduation, John Swartwout updated the club on this year's party. 
CYCLE TOUR MAJOR FUND-RAISER FOR ALBUQUERQUE CLUB

They call it TORGV for short. It sounds like something Norwegians might serve with lutefisk and lefse, but in New Mexico, it stands for Tour of the Rio Grande Valley, and it attracted 1440 bicyclists to Albuquerque in mid-April. It also had the decidely beneficial effect of raising at least \$23,000 for the Rotary Club of Albuquerque to carry out a variety of community projects during the coming year.

TORGV was 19 years old this year, but Albuquerque Rotarians have been involved only since 1989 when the local cycle association asked them to take it over. Since then, it has grown into one of the largest cycling events in the U.S. Southwest with riders, ages 7 to 75, from at least six states. The riders can choose one of five routes-27, 43, 65, 80 and 100 miles long. They pay entry fees and also solicit per-mile pledges for the benefit of the Albuquerque Rotary Club's charitable efforts.

Planning for TORGV begins a year in advance. On the day of the event this year, more than 200 Rotarians, including volunteers from the Albuquerque Del Norte and Belen Rotary clubs, were up before dawn to handle a variety of jobs including operating rest stops to keep the cyclists happy, healthy and safe.
