



Thanks to Space Center Rotary, students in the Bridgeport Communities in Schools Program will have transportation to important meetings and event. With generous donations of \$7,000 from Space Center Rotary Club and \$10,000 from the Assistant League of the Bay Area, Bridgeport recently purchased a 1992, 15 passenger Ford van from McRee Ford. Express signs, owned and operated by Space Center Rotarian Roy Slater, donated the lettering on the van which identifies Space Center Rotary Club and the Assistance League of the Bay Area as benefactors.

Bridgeport has just completed its fourth year as a dropout prevention program in CCISD. During that time student transportation was primarily provided by volunteers. Consequently, trips were limited and scheduling was uncertain. Good news: students were able to go to Corpus Christi on a field trip. Bad news: during this field trip the spare tire was stolen. Good news: Al Henkelman, owner of A to Z Tire & Battery, Inc., League City, donated a new spare tire and rim.

Space Center Rotary has always played an important role in the successes of Bridgeport. During President Billy Weseman's term of office, Bridgeport was selected as the primary beneficiary of that years Shrimporee. This helped Bridgeport get started. During the following years the youth committee has provide much needed support. Also, many Rotarians have become tutors and mentors in the Bridgeport program. 
