6/6 Today's speaker was John Lowery, our GSE Team Leader and a brand new Rotary Red Badger.

At irregular intervals, we send professionals for a group study exchange to visit other cultures.

These 4 to 5 week visits entail 12 hour work days and lots of hard work. John and his team members gave 25 presentations.

John told what an honor it was to be selected as a team member and how overwhelming the process was. First he had to write an application letter explaining why he would like to go, then when chosen, he had to appear before a 20 person selection team.

Once selected, he had to clear his schedule for the next 4 to 5 weeks. Rotary paid for the entire trip so he didn't have to worry about funding, but he did have to worry about his wife and responsibilities here.

With everything clear, he was able to visit majestic New Zealand with crystal clear streams, lush green forests and beautiful beaches. He didn't go swimming though as the water temperature was 20 degrees.

He did get to go tramping (which is a local phrase for hiking and does not mean the same as it does here).

In his tramping, he warned that you have to watch your footsteps. While New Zealand has only 3 million people, it does have 50 million sheep so you better watch your step. We thank John for watching his step and returning safely.

5/23 Bill Read, meteorologist-incharge of the National Weather Service, was today's speaker.

Mr. Read who lives locally, reminded us of the horrors and tremendous damage that hurricanes can cause.



He showed us slides of map overlays. It was quite clear that all of Houston is in a hurricane path.

As we know, most of Houston is less than 15 feet in height. So, a 20 foot storm surge would leave most of us under water.

Here in Clear Lake, we would have to pass through all of Houston to get to a safe area. Anyone who has gotten stuck in rush hour traffic knows how impossible this is.

Mr. Read suggested some safety measures that we are all aware of. In case you can't evacuate, find a high dry spot well away from windows, get into an enclosed area, kneel close to the ground, bend over and kiss your fanny good-by.

Always be prepared. If possible, have candles or some lighting source, canned food to sustain several days, a portable radio to keep in touch however - - - get the hell out early.
