

J.B. Fox has been involved in the HOSTS (Help One Student to Succeed) program in Pasadena Independent school district. He has been at Gardens Elementary for four years. He is also in the same program at McWhirter Elementary school in Webster. This program is a very rewarding program Pasadena has about 30 plus schools in the program, Webster has only two. The startup cost is \$40,000 and \$5,000 thereafter per year. This fee does not include the computers involved, as well programs to run them.
