How \$1,000 is Making a Difference By: Dr. David Taylor

Alex Gabriles of the River Onks Rotary Club appealed for financial support to help a 21-year old Russian student who has gotten accepted into an American university M.B.A. program but cannot afford the cost. There are both general reasons and specific reasons why we might want to contribute to this cause.

In general, Russia's future is tied to the modern, western, ethical

business model and bright young business people like Azamat can help lead the way. Azamat is a student prodigy who already has two college degrees in his Republic of Kabardia, speaks English fluently and will do extremely well at his studies in this program. He will succeed.

Specifically, our district knows Azamat and his father Slava, and last year his sister was a long term Rotary exchange student in Houston. She is a musical prodigy herself. His father first helped our district when Alex Gabriles began shipping supplies to the war torn parts of Russia during the first Chechnya rebellion some years ago. His father teaches at the medical school there and helped Alex to get the supplies where they belong.

His father is also the person who contacted us to host some high ranking law enforcement officials from their Republic three years ago. He accompanied that group as an interpreter. Those officials turned out to be the equivalent of the head of their F.B.L., their Attorney General, Vice Minister for Criminal Justice, etc. In other words, his family has been devoted to the fabric of a new Russian society.

It was Slava Koumykov who said they needed help with the criminal justice system and put that project together. It was his son Azamat who did all of the emailing and negotiating with us to set up the details of the trip. We feel like we know the young man personally and he is very impressive.


His education is just as likely to help Russia's future as the project to enlighten their law enforcement officials was. And we spent thousands on that police project.

So Alex Gabriles of River Oaks Rotary Club, who knows Azamat and his family quite well, appealed for a \$1,000 commitment from our club to permit Azamat to accept a position in the next M.B.A. class at the University of Hawaii. Azamat is such a remarkable young man that he is multi-lingual and has been employed by the United Nations as an interpreter.

He so impressed some Japanese visitors as their interpreter that they used their ties to the University of Hawaii to get him a scholarship in that M.B.A. program. He was then awarded a second scholarship, and along with donations from some Rotary clubs here in

Houston to defray living expenses, he has been able to enroll for this fall. To help put this assistance into perspective, Azamat's father holds three jobs at wages which would be inconceivable here in the U.S. to give his family a better chance at life.

Azamat's goal is to introduce the ethical western business model into the Russian economy -- a sorely needed paradigm. He may even teach some day in this regard. It's the old adage about teaching people to fish, is it not.

As the Chairman of Rotary International Convention of 2002 and on behalf of President elect Rick and Cherie King I am very pleased to invite you to join us in Barcelona on June 23 to 26, 2002. You have the date June 23-26, 2002.



You will feel immediately at home when you arrive in Barcelona. And you will feel the Mediterranean charm embrace you when you walk from the old fishing village where Columbus laid anchor on his return from the New World. Down the Rambla — derived not from rambling but from the Arabic word for dryer river course — and continue on this unique promenade with mime artists, bird sellers, cafes and kiosks, and a lot of friendly people.

The best way to enjoy Barcelona is on foot. If you look around, you will find much evidence of Barcelona's rich history as a maritime power, as a cultural center and as an architectural jewel. The Liceu, an opera house ravaged by fire in 1861 and 1964 was restored to its spiendor. Or walk through the Mercat de la Boqueria, a covered market known as one of the most attractive in Europe. The 150th anniversary of the great Catalan architect Gaudi will give you the opportunity to see his extravaganza architecture (Casa Battlo, La Pedrera) and in particular the unfinished intriguing cathedral, the Saagrada Familia — the Holy Family Cathedral, in which he lived and worked for 43 years of his life. Or maybe you prefer to relax on one of the benches in Gaudi astounding Parc Guell, a UNESCO world heritage site.

Did you know that Pablo Picasso started his work in Barcelona? The Picasso museum in the old part of the city features his early works. And you can also admire the artistic creations of Joan Miro, or the works of Antoni Tapies, the international known Catalonian artist still living and working in Barcelona as well as Catalonian painter Salvador Dali. Our convention site is also wonderful. Built in 1992 for the Olympics, San Jordi holds 18,000 seats to accommodate our main sessions. From the large square in front of the Palacio you can admire a wonderful view of Barcelona. A short walk brings you down to the Pueblo Espanol, the Spanish Village, a creation of the 1920 World's Fair and a reconstruction of houses from all over Spain in a rural setting.

Here our Host Committee is preparing a wonderful night, with Spanish folklore and enchanting music. Walking down you reach the two former royal palaces where the House of Friendship and the Club Project Exhibition are hosted. A splendid fountain provides some refreshing mist while you enjoy fellowship with old and new friends. And, at night you can admire the beautiful lights that light up the Barcelona sky.

With over 12,000 rooms in the downtown area, you can pick the hotel of your choice, from five stars to three stars with affordable rates. A fleet of buses and I assure you we will take a special care on transportation will bring you to all events.

You will not want to miss this spectacular convention. Thank you.




