

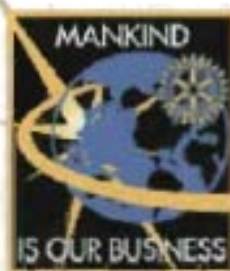

IF YOU LOSE YOUR PURSE OR WALLET

We've all heard horror stories about fraud that's committed in your name, address, SSN, credit, etc. Unfortunately I (the author of this piece who happens to be an attorney) have firsthand knowledge, because my wallet was stolen last month and within a week the thief(s) ordered an expensive monthly cell phone package, applied for a VISA credit card, had a credit line approved to buy a Gateway computer, received a PIN number from DMV to change my driving record information online, and more.

But here's some critical information to limit the damage in case this happens to you or someone you know. As everyone always advises, cancel your credit cards immediately, but the key is having the toll free numbers and your card numbers handy so you know whom to call. Keep those where you can find them easily.

File a police report immediately in the jurisdiction where it was stolen, this proves to credit providers you were diligent, and is a first step toward an investigation (if there ever is one).

But here's what is perhaps most important: (I never ever thought to do this) - Call the three national credit reporting organizations immediately to place a fraud alert on your name and SSN. I had never heard of doing that until advised by a bank that called to tell me an application for credit was made over the Internet in my name. The alert means any company that checks your credit knows your information was stolen and they have to contact you by phone to authorize new credit. By the time I was advised to do this, almost 2 weeks after the theft, all the damage had been done.

There are records of all the credit checks initiated by the thieves' purchases, none of which I knew about before placing the alert. Since then, no additional damage has been done, and the thieves threw my wallet away this weekend (someone turned it in). It seems to have stopped them in their tracks. The numbers are:

Experian (formerly TRW): 1-888-397-3742,

Trans Union: 1-800-680-7289,

Social Security Administration (fraud line): 1-800-269-0271

We pass along jokes; we pass along just about everything. Do think about passing this information along. It could really help someone.

Bolivian Water Project On Track REMINDER

This Summer, Rotary Foundation (through the Matching Grants Program), the Rotary Clubs of Space Center (5890), Friendswood (5910), and Wintertur (2000), and their respective District Leaders, will begin a Water Well Project in one of the poorest areas of the world, Bolivia. The resultant water source will serve the needs of two orphanages, supporting 300+ children in Cochabamba, Bolivia.

To date, Rotary has contributed \$31,000 of the \$51,000 project cost, with private donations to supplement the remainder. Should any Rotarian or Rotary Club be interested in participating in or contributing to this project, **THERE STILL IS TIME!** A special Rotary bank account has been established in Cochabamba to collect all donated funds, which will be managed and directed by the local Rotary Tunari Club.

THE EYES OF ROTARY ARE ON TEXAS!

The eyes of Rotary are on District 5890's project in Nicaragua, thanks to a compelling presentation at San Antonio's International convention. Led by **Frank Huezo**, who described the work being done for the victims of Hurricane Mitch, and most notably, children living in the garbage dump, our Rotarians brought the house down! Father Marco, speaking English publicly for the first time, also outlined the contributions by Rotarians. PDG **Steve Harris** completed the presentation with a wrap up and challenge to break the cycle of poverty, one village at a time.

The Presidents of each club, along with the ADGs, have received a copy of RI's videotape of the presentation at the San Antonio convention. Please feel free to use this video as a program for your club or give the tape to a potential sponsor for the upcoming Gala.

This year, the Nicaragua Gala will be held at the Hornberger Center on Saturday evening, September 22, 2001. After you finish off your BBQ with **Erie and Rhonda Kennedy**, change into your glitterati and come down to the Hornberger Center for the Gala! This year, our goal is to sell out all 80 tables! **Carolyn Farb** is the honorary chair again, and our own PDG **Steve Harris**, RI's co-chair on the Hunger Task Force, is the Chairman! Major corporate underwriters include Michael Cordua of America's restaurant fame and Americana Shipping Lines. This year, 100% of the costs of the gala are underwritten, so 100% of your dollars go to the families in Nicaragua.

You may remember at PDG **Painter's** conference in Galveston, Texas, **Jack Tucker** made a presentation about the housing project for the people of the dump. For \$450, Rotarians, friends, and clubs could sponsor a home for a family. Your \$450 contribution was matched by another NGO, Food for the Poor, and then the \$900 matched again by RI in a special housing grant, shepherded by PDG **Charlie Clemmons**. So yes, a home for \$1,800.00 was built; there are approximately 110 of 300 homes completed. Food for the Poor is building the remainder of the homes, which should be completed by October. This project has grown from the first international project for the Humble Intercontinental club five years ago to a large project supported by the majority of the clubs in District 5890. But what to do once the homes are built?

Rotarians throughout District 5890 are stepping forward again to begin the final step in breaking the cycle of poverty for the families of the Chinandega city dump. This year, proceeds from the gala will be spent on feeding the children at the school for the kids of the city dump (approx. \$90k annually) and the remainder to provide crops and livestock for the villagers. Each villager should receive fencing and materials for pens, 9 hens and 1 lucky rooster, several lime trees, several papaya trees, several plantain trees, seeds for tomatoes, cucumbers, beans, onions, herbs, etc. The estimated cost for each family is approximately \$600, and the goal is to have each family self sufficient within the next 6 months. Just like the housing project, each family is responsible for building the fences, pens, and gardens.

Is this project doable? You're darn right it is, but it's going to take the financial support of Rotarians and friends. Come join us at the gala as PDG **Steve** and Father **Marco** and the kids from the choir lead the charge in breaking the cycle of poverty, one village at a time. If you would like PDG **Steve** or **Jack** to give a program on what's happening in Nicaragua, please contact **Steve's** office at 281.980.1050. If you would like to make the next trip to Nicaragua, sign up with **Frank Huezo** at 281.446.0405 for October 25-29. If you, your club, or business associates would like to sponsor a table, please let your ADG and **Frank** know by August 15. Additional sponsorships will be accepted and recognized in the program at the gala, but we must meet our printing deadline of September 1. Let's keep the eyes of Rotary shining brightly on the work of the many Rotarians throughout District 5890 who are working to break the cycle of poverty, one village at a time. See ya at the Gala!

We are seeking qualified former club Presidents to be nominated for District Governor (DG) for the year 2003 - 2004. Rotary's Manual of Procedure (MOP) directs that the DG Adams notify each of you of your club's right to propose a candidate for District Governor. To acquaint any potential DG nominee, the District Governor Nominating Committee (DGNC) is having a meeting (by invitation) on August 19, 2001 at the Rotary House International, 1600 Holcombe Boulevard, in the Medical Center, at 4:00 PM. At this meeting, the committee will explain the functions of a DG under the District Leadership Plan (DLP) that began in 1997. The agenda includes a discussion of the opportunities for the DG and for the sponsoring club, as well as time and financial commitments. All DG's who served under the DLP will be available at that meeting to answer questions.

We want your club to be included. You may contact any DGNC member, any ADG, or any DG that served under the DLP. This includes PDG's **Steve Harris, Bob Franklin, John Painter, and Charlie Clemmons**. They will see that potential governors from your club are invited. If you do not have a candidate for 2003 - 2004, but believe you may have one for 2004 - 2005, you are invited to submit the candidates name to one of those listed above so that we can extend an invitation to them also. In the meantime, the committee will be happy to answer any of your questions. Be advised that Rotary International (RI) does not allow campaigning for DG, and no member of the DGNC may discuss a candidate's qualifications.

The deadline for submitting a name and the approval of your club is October 13, 2001. They must be approved by a vote of your club members at a regular meeting. Your club may only nominate one candidate for 2003 - 2004, but anyone qualified and interested should be encouraged to contact the DGNC so their name can be put on the invitation list. Applications will be accepted anytime after August 3, 2001 and may be emailed, faxed, or mailed.

Please see that anyone you propose attends the August 19, 2001 meeting. This is one of the few times the Board of Directors cannot make a final decision for the Club. The candidate must be approved by their club members at a regular meeting.
