

The float design pictured was selected by the Rotary Rose Float Committee for Rotary's entry in the 2002 Tournament of Roses Parade. The float theme was *Around the World thru Education*. "Good Times" the theme for the 2002 Tournament of Roses.



A Rotary float has been entered in every Tournament of Roses Parade since 1980. The 2001 float won the Volunteers Trophy for the "best floral design of Parade theme under 35 feet in length."

Over 425 million people see the Rose Parade New Year's Day with an estimated U.S. audience of 90 million people and an estimated international audience of more than 325 million in over 100 countries.

The float is funded entirely by voluntary contributions from Rotary Clubs and Rotarians throughout the United States. Rotarians together with members of Rotaract and Interact clubs donate their time and effort to decorate the float. Construction begins in Spring and the float is ready for decoration in November.
