JIM MANZOLILLO
HOUSTON MARITIME MUSEUM
SHIP BUILDING - "MEXICAN STYLE"

From India, to the Belgium Congo, to Kuwait, ships designed by Jim Manzolillo, Naval Architect and Marine Engineer, may be found. Jim's ships were built in his Mexican shipyards.

Starting with a small shippard in Mexico
City, which is 7,400 feet above sea level, Jim
began an exciting and unusual twenty-three year
career. According to Jim, his some of his
experiences have been unusual, some amusing,
and all, challenging.

During those years, Jim ended up with two shipyards (one on each coast), over 200 employees, and 240 work vessels delivered to 30 different countries. His success, he believes, was due in large part to the benefits provided by Mexico itself.

Jim, who is the founder and curator of the Houston Maritime Museum, opened its doors in December, 2000, and is our guest speaker.


Excerpt from JB Fox's Quarterly Report:

A pavilion is proposed to be built and donated to Nassau Bay, TX. who will maintain it throughout it's life.

Our Foundation has been seeking such a project for some years, and has decided unanimously to commit to it's construction.

The proposed site will overlook NASA-JSC, located next to the T-38s in the same area.

All of this however, is contingent upon mutual agreement between Nassau Bay, Space Center park and NASA-JSC.



The proposed site, being located as it is, would give Rotary the visibility we desire plus being a convenient service to the community.

This Omega "moon watch" is valued at \$3,200. Travis Vermeer of Ben Bridge Jewelers at Baybrook Mall has donated this watch to be raffled off. Raffle tickets are twenty dollars each, or 6 tickets for one hundred dollars. Only 500 tickets will be sold. Winner will be drawn at the VIP Boots and Black Ties Ball on May 5th. Here is the history on this extremely unique watch:

On 1st March 1965, OMEGA's Speedmaster chronograph was "flight-qualified by NASA for all manned space missions" as the only wristwatch to have withstood all of the U.S. space agency's severe tests under conditions of zero gravity and magnetic fields, extreme shocks, vibrations and temperatures ranging from -18 to +93 degrees Celsius.

In the same month, the watch was for the first time worn officially on board the Gemini 3 mission.

In April 1970, the OMEGA Speedmaster rescued the Apollo 13 mission from a potential disaster, earning OMEGA the "Snoopy Award", the highest distinction awarded by the NASA astronauts. In another historical event, the Speedmaster was worn on the wrists of both the American astronaut Tom Stafford and the Russian cosmonaut Alexei Leonov during the historic Apollo-Soyuz space rendezvous. This was the first time the cosmonauts also wore the OMEGA Speedmaster. Ever since, the Speedmaster has been the official chronograph of all Russian manned space missions.

The greatest moment in the Speedmaster's history was undoubtedly 20 July 1969 at 02156 GMT, when it recorded man's first steps on the Moon's surface. The Apollo 11 mission was a milestone in history and the Speedmaster became the first watch (and the only watch since) to be worn on the Moon. With this unique accomplishment came a unique nickname: the Moon Watch.
