Alan recently said: "Through this program I have met young people from all over the world— Japan, the Philippines, the Scandinavian countries, Russia, Hungary, Turkey, Europe, South Africa, South America, Mexico, Australia, New Zealand and others. I have enjoyed watching their transition from initial shyness as they are becoming accustomed to a new environment and the English language to the point where when their year has ended, they have matured in their knowledge of our way of life and are sad to leave new friends. Each year with a different set of Rotary Exchange students, I find myself becoming more understanding of other places in the world."

The International Youth Exchange program makes a lasting difference to the students involved, of course. But it also makes a difference to our club members who have been their hosts and to those who have met them. Just ask Karen Birchenough, Bill and Joan Geissler, Doug and Joyce Schuler, Dixie Robison, David Taylor and, of course, Alan and Mary Allen Wylie, among others.
