Dear Virgil:

Enclosed is the Extension Survey for the Space Center area. You will notice we have a total of 84 classifications, also the possibilities for adding many more in the next few years.

It is my hope that we may have a favorable report from R.I. on this survey so that we can go ahead with the formation of our Charter group. In fact, I'm hoping that we will have such approval within the next couple of weeks if it is at all possible.
