Brief History of Organization: On May-22, 1964, the Extension Survey was forwarded to Gov. Virgil Lee. Rotary International promptly accepted the survey and instructed us to proweed with the organization of a Rotary Club in this area. Meetings have been held each week since that time, also additional meetings were held when it was thought advisable. We found, after our original survey there were many more avilable classifications in the area than we had anticipated; quite a number of them not to be found in the Classification book, due to the nature of the business in this area, which you, Iom sure realize. During the past several weeks we have been completing our Charter List, adopting constitution and by-laws, electing officers and directors, etc. We now have what we believe to be a representative group of men from the area, and we also believe we have the potential of a good Rotary Club. We have had several Past District Governors talk with the group to inform them about Rotary. Plans are to continue this Rotary education for a while to properly indoctrinate these new Rotarians. You will notice we have eight former Rotarians in the group, which will be of considerable help. The men seem to be anxious to become "official" Rotarians and I recommend acceptance of the Charter List.

I certify that the officers and members of this provisional Rotary club understand the fundamental characteristics of Rotary as described in the application for membership form, and the provisions of the constitution and by-laws adopted by the club. The charter members possess the qualifications for membership in a Rotary club, and the place of business of each active member is located within the territorial limits of this provisional club. The board of directors of R.I. has defined "place of business" as follows: "In relation to active membership in a Rotary club, 'place of business' is understood to mean the establishment from which the active member normally administers his business or professional responsibilities and activities."

I recommend the admission of this club as a member of Rotary International.
