A.

1. On September 13, have the Rotary Foundation Recipient as our guest speaker.
2. Declare the week of September 13th as Rotary Foundation Week.
3. Give at this time before the speaker is introduced, a five minute explanation as to what Rotary Foundation is.

B. During the Fall Semester of school this year, go to Clear Creek High School and look for Recipients of Rotary Undergraduate Scholarship Grants. Have their application and qualifications completed by December Christmas Holidays. Then by Easter Holidays have our selection ready to send to District.

C. Encourage an active support campaign for the Foundation.

D. Establish a "Birthday Rotary Foundation Fund."

On September 13th. Rotary Foundation Week was declared at Space Center Rotary Club. A program was presented with our guest speaker as Mr. James B. Rylander, an attorney, who had received a "Rotary Fellowship of International Understanding", from the Downtown district of San Antonio. His fellowship was to the University of Chile at Santo De Chile. His program was on his studies and understanding of Chilean politics.

In December, the committee will be engaged in selections of candidates from Clear Creek High School for Recipient of a Rotary Undergraduate Scholarship. They will be selected from school records and then be asked to fill out an application during the Christmas Holidays. Then by the Easter Holidays our Candidate will be selected to be presented to District.

The Committee will also, in December, establish a Birthday Foundation Fund to begin on January 1, 1972.

Our Committee is actively engaged in a campaign for the "Rotary Foundation", and will strive to obtain these goals.

Subject: Sergeant-at-Arms Committee Report

Rotary visit
The Space Center Club provided a trip for kids of Rotarians attending the Rotary International Convention to visit NASA's Manned Space Center. It was estimated that a 1000 kids would be involved.
