
The committee has been studying several World Community Projects in Mexico to determine which Rotary club and project the Space Center should serve as an "assisting club." This was done after correspondence with Rotary International.

The projects under study are as follows:

- ***1) By Tepic Rotary club of Tepic, State of Nayarit, Mexico. Project 1506. To buy a special Blood Bank Refrigerator to be donated to the public hospital that would supervise and attend to the project with respect to its equipment, blood bags, and antigens. In this way it is hoped, in a permanent way, the lack of blood in stock. This service would be available in an area of 500,000 people, largely peasants with low economic resources.
- ***2) By Tepic Rotary Club of Tepic, State of Nayarit, Mexico. Project 547. The formation of a public library that will satisfy the needs of a great number of students at the recently organized university, and also the town's needs. The town does not have a public library
- ***3. By the Rotary club of Naucalpany, Mexico. Project 1530. To buy complete regulation football equipment for the following American Football teams of Naucalpan, Pielas Rojas, Espartanos and Bucaneros, Mexico in the western suburbs of Mexico City. They operate teams from ages six (6) to twenty-three (23).

The committee selected project# 3.

The committee is following complete procedures suggested by Rotary International.
