Continue to support existing programs, start new programs and investigate potential new starts - continue efforts to initiate an Aerospace Awards program, of a national scale, to include an Award Dinner and proceeds of which would support aerospace students thru scholarships. This dinner is planned for early Spring 1987.

Handicapped: Provide computers and computer equipment to support handicapped student education programs in local schools.

Recreation and Camps: Continue investigation of the possibility of a joint-venture w/Harris County in creating a Community Service Center.

Safety: Support Clear Lake Emergency Medical Corps., boating safety, fireboat, hurricane preparedness, emergency evacuation plans, awareness of drinking/driving, CPR training, and fire safety.

Environment: Promote awareness thru programs at club meetings. Investigate the initiation of the Living Way Project to beautify NASA Road One.

Cultural Activities: Investigate requirement and appropriateness of initiating the I Care Project; To help integrate the newly arrived El Salvadorians into our community.

Scholarships, Awards, Loans: Continue to provide scholarships at Clear Lake High School/University of Houston at Clear Lake.

Student Guests:

Youth (including Youth Activities Month): Continue to support area youth groups. Investigate/support new starts especially pertinent to area needs this year.

Service to the Aged: Continue to support area Senior Citizens groups - Investigate support of new programs.

Other: Continue support of the high school student experiment reserved as a Get-Away-Special payload on the Space Shuttle Transportation System.
