My granddaughter from St. Louis sings in a choir of children ranging in age from 11 to 14. We then trained to Paris for 4 days where we were joined by my cousin from Salzburg, Austria. Her ex-husband was a Frenchman and she of course speaks French very well. We rented a car in Paris and drove to Hesse, Germany and stayed with a Rotarian who we had at our house last year during a Friendship exchange for a couple of nights. We then drove to Salzburg and stayed at my cousin's for almost a week. Also met a second cousin on my father's side I had never met before who lives in Munich. My Salzburg cousin invited him down for the day. He brought about a 3 dozen weiss wurst (bock), a case of weiss beer, the brotchen which look like our big pretzels only better, and the special mustard that goes with the sausage. Difficult to get up from the table. We did a lot of eating and drinking especially in Germany and Austria. All in all we were gone from the 10th of June and returned to St. Louis the 5th of July. It was a wonderful trip especially since we spent it with our oldest daughter and her family who we essentially left in St. Louis 26 years ago when we came to Houston. Had an interesting event on trip to Hesse.

I did attend a Rotary meeting at the Salzburg club on June 29th and it was their passing of the gavel. They are an evening meeting club and their meetings are usually a couple of hours long. This one lasted three hours but the ceremony was about a half hour. The rest of the evening was eating and drinking with wives invited. They have no women members. They did say that one of the Vienna clubs has a woman member.

The past year has been an enjoyable one for me. I can't say that I have really looked forward to stepping down as president of the club. I was told going in that the club runs itself and I believe it. Hopefully I didn't impede the club progress too much. The club was its usual active self in giving scholarship money to local high school students, various youth organizations and again presenting the teacher, policeman and school nurse of the year awards. We sponsored 3 Interact clubs this year. The Rotary National Space

Achievement Award dinner was again a smashing success and the club's own endowment fund is approaching the \$100,000 mark. Our end of the year party netted \$1000 for the endowment fund and \$2000 was also given from the Service fund. Surplus computers were installed at 3 senior citizen nursing/retirement homes and at the Bay Area Turning Point.

On the international scene we again sponsored a foreign exchange student (as we have done the past 11 years), supported the Nicaraguan kids by buying a table at the gala given by the Humble Rotary Club, raised \$7500 for Rotary International through the district raffle which our Gene Tromblee won, and we committed \$2000 towards drilling a well for a Bolivia (Cochabamba) orphanage that Stan Galanski is promoting. We also brought back six Mexican children who had been previously treated by Dr. Fustock for further plastic surgery treatment.

Our membership held around 162, i.e. we lost and gained about 15 members. Obviously one area where we can always stand improvement is getting our new members active in the clubs programs. This should be a commitment from the sponsor to get new members involved and becoming real Rotarians in the act of "Service Above Self"
