

Major Objectives 2001-2002

Membership Development

1. We will average one new member per month with a net club growth of five members.
2. At least three club members will attend the district membership seminar.
3. We will conduct a club assembly/meeting to develop a club membership strategy.
4. We will implement the Strategies for Member Education program in our club.

Public Image

1. We will conduct a club assembly/meeting and implement a plan to promote Rotary within the community.
2. We will implement a program recognizing an outstanding vocational achievement by a club member.
3. We will implement a program to encourage club members to wear their Rotary pin daily.
4. We will appropriately display the Rotary emblem in the community.
5. We will receive significant media coverage of Rotary club events on at least six occasions.
6. We will place Rotary information "spots" or advertisements in the newspaper, on the radio and/or on TV.

Rotary Education and Training

1. We will send our club president, secretary, treasurer, and at least four club directors (or their designates) to attend the 2001 district assembly.
2. We will send our club president, secretary, and treasurer (or their designates) to attend/register for the district conference.
3. We will encourage 15% of our club members to attend/register for the district conference.
4. We will encourage 50% of new club members to attend/register for the district conference.
5. We will welcome all new members into the club through a formal induction ceremony.

Club Development and Improvement

1. We will continue to produce a regular club communication.
2. We will maintain a current club directory.
3. We will conduct quality weekly meeting programming.
4. We will conduct six meetings concerning Rotary Programs or projects.
5. We will implement a procedure to discourage members from leaving club meetings early.
6. We will sponsor/participate and complete at least one new community service project.
7. We will sponsor/participate and complete at least one new World Community Service or PolioPlus Partners project.

8. We will host/sponsor at least one Rotary Volunteer, Youth Exchange student, Rotary Foundation Scholar, or Group Study Exchange team member.

3. I will wear my Rotary pin at business and social events.
4. I will represent my club at appropriate community events.
5. I will address my local community on the role of Rotary in the community and world at least twice.

8. I will attend/register for the district conference.
9. I will attend the 2001 Rotary International Convention in San Antonio, Texas.
10. I will hold a Rotary information meeting at the club on a minimum of six occasions.

Fund-raising

1. Our major fundraiser, the Shrimporee, will be held on Saturday, September 22, 2001. This will be the 28th annual Shrimporee and applications will be made available to prospective major beneficiaries. A committee has been formed to evaluate the applications and to recommend which organization should benefit from our Shrimporee.
2. Our Wine Tasting will precede the Shrimporee in an effort to attract people who may not attend our Shrimporee.
3. A goal of 10% of the Shrimporee funds will go to the Space Center Rotary Endowment Foundation. It is recommended that this plan start with the 2000-2001 board and continue for ten consecutive years, in an effort to build up our own Endowment. Over the next year, the board can select a project for the Endowment funds.
